The inspiration for the title was apparently a 75mm Howitzer field gun used by the French and the Americans in World War 1. The gun was known for its accuracy and speed, and the French 75 is said to have such a kick that it felt like being hit by just such a weapon

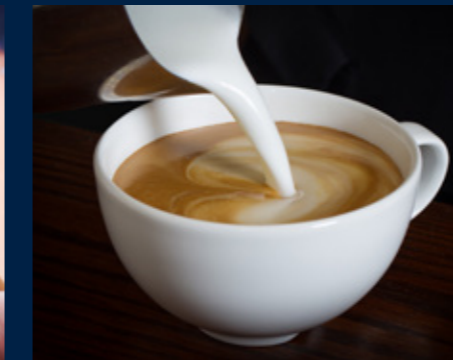
Made with London dry gin, lemon juice, sugar, and Champagne.

Royal Highball Cocktail

Legend has it that the Royal Highball cocktail was developed by renowned Ritz barman Frank Meier in honor of King Alfonso at the opening of the Ritz bar, in 1921 in Paris. The festive, yet strong sparkler is made from Cognac, Champagne, and muddled strawberries. In acknowledgement of King Alfonso's seemingly limitless appetite of Champagne and spirits, Meier would serve the cocktail in a large highball glass, nearly double the size of a typical Champagne flute. But, apparently, the king grew increasingly dedicated to his "more is more" motto over the years. We serve it in a Champagne flute.

The classics...

Vodka Martini

Truth be told, no one knows exactly the origin of the martini. One account holds that Italian immigrant bartender Martini di Arma di Taggia invented the drink at the Knickerbocker Hotel in New York City before World War I. His recipe contained dry gin and dry vermouth, in equal parts, and orange bitters. This is for the true vodka lovers; this is made up of vodka and vermouth only.

Old Fashioned

The first use of the name "Old Fashioned" for a Bourbon whiskey cocktail was said to have been at the Pendennis Club, a gentlemen's club founded in 1881 in Louisville, Kentucky. The recipe was said to have been invented by a bartender at that club in honor of Colonel James E. Pepper, a prominent bourbon distiller, who brought it to the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel bar in New York City. First founded in 1806; a perfect balance of whiskey, angostura bitters, sugar and water

Daiquiri

It is difficult to know for certain the circumstances surrounding the birth of the Daiquiri Cocktail. However, many agree on its creator, Jennings Stockton Cox, and its birthplace, the iron mines of Daiquiri in Cuba.

Refreshing and tangy combination of sweet and sour; white rum, lime juice and sugar syrup

Negroni

The most widely reported version of this drink's origin is that it was invented at Caffè Casoni in Florence, Italy in 1919. Legend tells that Count Camillo Negroni asked his friend, bartender Forasco Scarselli, to strengthen his favourite cocktail – the Americano – by replacing the soda water with gin. Scarselli added an orange garnish, rather than the lemon you'd usually get with an Americano, and the drink took off. Before long, everyone was coming into the bar for a 'Negroni.'

The very definition of balance and simplicity; Gordon's Gin, Campari and Rosso vermouth.
